#### **Theme**

The INSPIRE Directive on standardization of spatial data is in many cases insufficient to establish forms of dialogue and co-planning between cooperating countries. Goal of the Project Plan4all is the harmonization of data description and territorial planning, in accordance with the INSPIRE Directive, through the study and benchmarking of best practices and national as well as regional standards currently used in EU regions and municipalities and of the results of research projects in progress.

#### **Achievements**

The results are creating a comparison place and a discussion forum for the identification of a common platform including the standardization of territorial metadata of the European territory; they are consistent with the INSPIRE Directive and able to develop transferability and comparability models to be shared by European regions as well as to define common parameters for the geographical description, planning and territorial management.

The project had a total cost of € 4,125,000.00. Regione Lazio had a budget of € 187,470.00.
